Mock said auditions were held in January for the students, who have been rehearsing three days a week since.

"The students are quite excited about this show," Mock said. "Backdrops and scenic elements are being finalized this week, and costumes are in, which always excites the kids."

The performance will be the department's third this year, but it will be the year's first musical, and the play will be accompanied by the talents of AHS band and choir members.

The play will also include the songs "No Way To Stop It" and "How Can Love Survive" taken from the original 1959 stage musical.

Mock said working with the cast of students has been a "tremendous joy."

"There are many seniors in this production with whom I've had the privilege of working with since they were 10th graders," Mock said. "This class of seniors has truly been a delight to me."

"There are also some new members to our cast who will be making their debut on the AHS stage, and it has been great to watch the veterans mentor the new cast members."
